Dear Parishioners,

We all know that one of the effects of sin is that it breaks down relationships. On the other hand, the chief effect of the resurrection is that Christ restores unity through peace. But, according to the second reading, his disciples must work for it by living the kind of life that God wants. This is what St. John said while addressing the Church, "My children, our love is not to be just in words or mere talk, but in deed and in truth." In this way, the disciples of Jesus must build themselves up. The first reading gives us a clue on how this is done, by singling out the action of Barnabas, a good man filled with the Holy Spirit and faith (Acts 11:24). What Barnabas did for Saul is a beautiful example for the Church and every Christian. Saul had met with resistance when he had reached Jerusalem, after his encounter with the Risen Lord on his way to Damascus. The disciples were afraid of Saul because they could not believe that he was a changed person, and had really become a disciple of Jesus. His track record as a persecutor of Christians had not yet dissipated. They were not yet able to trust him, for fear that he would again betray them. To quote the reading, "When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple." It was at this point that Barnabas stepped in and took charge of Saul, and introduced him to the apostles and told them that on the way to Damascus, Jesus had appeared to him and the real conversion of Saul had taken place, and his name became Paul

As we know, Barnabas was also known as the son of encouragement, and we see that he was indeed true to his name. Paul, at this point, was bewildered and shaken, and Barnabas stood as guarantee for Paul. Paul was encouraged by such support and started to go around preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord, in the Holy City of Jerusalem, which was the center of Judaism. We can all imagine how far an encouraging word, a pat on the back, or determined support by someone, can influence the course of events in the life of a person. We can see that this happened in the life of St. Paul. Similarly, the Church is expected to take us by the hand and offer support when we are liable to fall. The Church must show her love and support not just by words, but by encouragement, and not merely by empty talk, but by concrete actions of solidarity and strength. In this, we see the people of God.

Today, the Church as a whole should ask herself, what is she doing as one who provides encouragement? Will she take care of the confused and struggling brother or sister, or support the one who gives unrelenting support to our faith, such as the lonely missionary at the frontier, in a remote area or a crowded hostile environment? Will she support the discouraged priests, religious, or laypersons who feel their ideas and plans are rejected, and feel ignored? What are we doing to build ourselves up or to build up the Church? For this, Jesus in today's Gospel is asking us to remain united in Him. To remain united in Him, we have to listen to Him and keep His words, believing that Jesus is the real vine and we can do nothing without Him. When Christians get together and live in Christ, then through the power of the Holy Spirit love reigns in our hearts, and then the Church can build herself up and we will see wonderful things happening in the Church. As we are preparing ourselves for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, let us continue to live in the Easter joy. May the Lord bless all of us during this Easter Season and remain united in him, and prepare ourselves for the feast of Pentecost.



1st Saturday Mass is at 8:00am on Saturday, May 4th.






May Crowning at the Grotto

Prayers and Sympathy are extended to the families of Myron D. Culberson and Murral Bourgoyne Brown upon their deaths.




Church Membership Directory Drive
