Dear Parishioners,

The official title for today's feast is *Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord*. We often refer to it as Palm Sunday for brevity's sake, but the longer title reminds us that the central focus of Holy Week is always Christ's passion. We unite ourselves with Christ's suffering on the cross in order to inherit the glorious crown he won for us.

Father John Kavanaugh, S.J., once observed that Christ "entered the Garden of Gethsemane to rectify the Garden of Eden." The forced disruption of our lives caused by this global health crisis can be a blessed opportunity for us to spiritually accompany our Savior as he brings light to a world covered in darkness.

So how do we observe Holy Week without being able to attend church together? We can't hold a Palm Sunday procession as usual but I encourage everyone to find a quiet spot either indoors or out and prayerfully read the Passion (Matthew 26:14 – 27:66). You may wish to listen to a song or two associated with this day such as "All Glory, Laud, and Honor," or "O Sacred Head Surrounded."

As mentioned last week, I will bless palms on Palm Sunday in the hope that you will be permitted to stop by the church and pick one up for home. I urge caution as you take a palm so as to not endanger yourself or others.


On Holy Thursday evening, you can watch a televised service of the Mass of the Lord's Supper, or read the Gospel for the Mass (John 13:1-15). The Mass on Holy Thursday celebrates both the institution of the Eucharist and the institution of the priesthood, which makes our separation from one another especially piercing on this day. But we are never separated from the Lord so pray with spiritual hymns such as "Our Blessing Cup (Psalm 116)," or "Ubi Caritas."

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence, and a day to focus on the cross. The gospel for today is the Passion from the Gospel of John 18:1 – 19:42. You might pray the Stations of the Cross privately or as a family, and you might also pray with hymns such as "Were You There," "Jesus Walked This Lonesome Valley," or "What Wondrous Love Is This."

On Easter Sunday I will once again light a new Easter candle and bring it into the church to light our way for the coming year. The celebration of Christ's Resurrection is never canceled or postponed, and I pray we will experience it anew in our hearts as we wake on Easter Sunday morning. The Gospel for Easter Sunday is John 20:1-9.

I will continue to post my homilies on my Facebook page, and I pray you have a blessed Holy Week even given these exceptional circumstances.




CANCELLATIONS AND POSTPONEMENTS THROUGH APRIL 13TH IN OUR CHURCH PARISH

- The CHURCH OFFICE will be closed during this time.




First Communion & Retreat Scheduled for April 18th & 19th will be postponed due to the social distancing order extended through April 30th. A new date will be issued after April 30th.
