CARE OF THE SICK


Emergency calls answered as soon as possible. Communion calls to homebound weekly by request. Please notify the office if someone is homebound.

Dear Parishioners,

Since August 15th falls on a Sunday this year, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary replaces the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel reading for the feast day is Mary's visit to Elizabeth and her beautiful *Magnificat*, as told in Luke 1:39-56. In both speech and action, Mary proclaims the greatness of the Lord and finds joy in God her Savior.

The Catholic writer and speaker Amy Welborn offered this brief reflection: "Sometimes I try to imagine my Christian faith without Mary, and I can't. She provides the answer to the question of how to respond to Jesus—which is the central question of the spiritual life. She teaches me how to welcome Jesus into my life, how to be taught by him, how to say yes, how to live in hope. And here, in the Magnificat, offered for meditation on the feast of the Assumption, the beginning of Mary's earthly life with Jesus are linked to her earthly end."

Our Rita's Closet Thrift Shop operated by the Zippers is closed for the immediate future due to the surge in hospitalizations caused by the delta variant. Our volunteers and patrons have generally been sensitive to one another's health, but the close quarters of the rooms and the age of some of our volunteers made this decision the right one.




