Family should contact the Pastor to begin funeral arrangements.



Dear Parishioners,

When Jesus asked his disciples, "What do people say about me?" They probably thought that he wanted to know about his popularity rating. According to the people of his time, being popular was important, but not to Jesus. Jesus was not interested in knowing how popular or famous he was, nor did he pursue popularity. By asking the disciples that question, Jesus really wanted to know if the people and the disciples in particular, had fully understood him. Fortunately, St. Peter on behalf of the disciples gave Jesus a very convincing answer, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." We hear Jesus approving of his answer by replying, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father." Peter's answer reveals to us that all human categories and all human terms are inadequate to describe Jesus. Peter was no philosopher or theologian. He did not arrive at this knowledge of Jesus by studies and research, but by his personal encounter and his firsthand experience of Jesus. It's not from his knowledge about Jesus, but his knowledge of Jesus that Peter could give this convincing answer. Once Jesus knew that Peter understood him correctly, he



entrusts Peter with a mission. Peter was given the authority "to bind and to loose", and to lead the Church.

Jesus addresses the same question to each one of us: "Who do you say that I am?" The question of Jesus was a personal one to the disciples, it's a personal one to us too, and this demands a personal answer. It's a critical question that calls us to a commitment which will also determine our entire destiny. Regardless of where we are, all of us are confronted with this question. If Jesus is truly God's Son, then, either we have to confess it and act accordingly, or deny it and do our own thing. Therefore, to answer this question, we must have a personal encounter with Christ, a personal experience of Jesus. Let us ask ourselves, how will I, as an individual, answer this question?

Can I say that Jesus is my most faithful friend, the one who loves me even when the whole world despises me? When others are blind and deaf to me, Jesus sees and hears me; Jesus waits patiently to reconcile me with the Father. Holman Hunt's famous picture entitled, "Christ, The Light of the World", shows Jesus in a garden at midnight, holding a lantern and knocking at a large door with heavy panels. When the painting was unveiled, critics found fault with it; there was no knob on the door. To them, Hunt answered, "It was deliberately left out. That is the door to the human heart. It can only be opened from the inside." In order to open the door of our heart for Jesus, one should really know who he is, or else the one knocking could very well be considered a stranger and a nuisance. Once we have known him as the Messiah, the Son of the living God, will we hear his knock and open eagerly, and welcome him in and offer the center of our heart?

If Jesus is the Son of the living God for us, then he must be living in our midst. Therefore, we must use all means available to us to experience him. One way of experiencing Christ can be daily, meditation of the Bible. An African Chief wanted to know the secret of Britain's greatness. Queen Victoria, holding a bible in her hand, said, "Tell the Chief that this book is the secret of our greatness." Let us all read something from it daily and meditate. Another way of experiencing Christ is by sharing our faith-experiences with others. Those who share regularly will find it very fruitful and helpful in holding on to one's faith and making our faith stronger. Another means of encountering Christ is through prayer. As Tagore, an Indian writer said, "God respects me when I work, but loves me when I sing his praises." Hence, in the hustle and bustle of our lives, we must find time to kneel before God in prayer, with all our frailties, and in humility. For us Catholics, the sure and certain way of experiencing Christ is through the Eucharist. In the Holy Eucharist we celebrate the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, and we receive his precious body and blood. Therefore, whenever we gather to experience the Lord personally in the Holy Eucharist, we need to thank the Lord for the wonderful sacrifice of the Mass and all the other means He provides us to experience Him in a personal way. Pray that we all may have a meaningful experience of him, and for the grace to sustain our faith and commit ourselves to the mission He has entrusted to us.




There will be no Religion Classes for K-8 from September 4th-6th due to the Labor Day holiday.
