Dear Parishioners,

All of us have experienced failures in life and realized that many of our plans and good resolutions have remained unfulfilled. We, therefore, have a better understanding of the value and need of making a new beginning. Through this new liturgical year, which starts with Advent, the Church is giving us another chance to take a fresh look at ourselves and to mold our lives according to the pattern set in the Gospel. Advent is a time to prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ and receive Him into our hearts. With Jesus, we will be able to keep our promises and resolutions and live our lives according to the pattern set by Christ.

Today's Gospel tells us the need to always be prepared to receive Jesus. We have to wake up from our slumber, our passivity, for the time of his arrival is near. The Gospel says, "Watch all the time and pray." There is a story of a fire breaking out in a house in which a man is asleep. Seeing the fire, the neighbors came and tried to carry him out through a window. No way, so they tried to carry him through the door. Again, no way; he was just too huge and heavy. They were pretty desperate until someone suggested, "Wake him up, then he can get out by himself." Most often we are asleep, and even people who try to help us also seem to be asleep. They do not know what to do with us. This is the time when the Church discovers the season of Advent. She is asking us to wake up so that we can prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord. Only when we are awake can we know where we are, and what we need to do. Advent is a wakeup call for us, to make us rise from our slumber and passivity. This is a time for us to watch and pray.

Advent makes us all aware of the importance of prayer in our lives. We need to make a prayer commitment, so that we can always remain connected to the Lord. Advent and Lent seasons are great times to make a prayer commitment. During this Advent season, let us try to give more importance to our prayer life. I know that Advent is a very busy time for us, as we all get involved in buying and exchanging gifts, making cookies, decorating homes, attending parties, etc. Without Jesus, what Christmas can we have? What meaning will all these things have without Jesus, in whose name we do them? I won't be wrong in saying that in the hustle and bustle of this season we don't get time to even think of Jesus.

I think, the western world has commercialized Christmas so much that we give little or no attention to the real meaning of this feast. All of the outer preparations are fine, but what about the internal preparations? The preparation of our hearts and our souls? How much time do we plan to spend in prayer and reflection during this Advent season? Remember that prayer doesn't come that easily for many people. People have to make a conscious effort to pray. They have to make some kind of resolution to spend time in prayer and try to be faithful to that resolution. That is why we need to make an extra effort to bring Jesus into this season, into our homes and into the celebration of Christmas. Let us commit ourselves to some kind of prayer and try to follow through with the commitment we make. Once a man asked, "What did you gain by regularly praying to God?" The man replied, "Nothing. But let me tell you what I lost: anger, ego, greed, depression, insecurity and fear of death." Sometimes the answer to our prayers is not gaining, but losing; which is ultimately gaining. My prayer during this season of Advent is that we not forget the focus of the celebration of Christmas, but keep Jesus, who is the focus of Christmas, in our hearts, in our homes and all that we do, so that we do not miss His coming. May God bless you and guide you through this season of Advent.
