Dear Parishioners,

I will be in New Orleans on Wednesday and Thursday of this week enjoying a bit of fraternity with my brother priests in celebration of Alumni Day at Notre Dame Seminary. I usually try to attend Alumni Day each year to enjoy some priestly fraternity, visit with our seminarians, and support the good work of the seminary. We will have a Communion Service here on Thursday morning in my absence.

Our diocese started the year with 18 seminarians: 6 studying at Notre Dame Seminary and 12 studying at St. Joseph Seminary College. It is always our hope that between 60 to 70% of those who enter the seminary will eventually be ordained priests. We have two men scheduled for ordination this May – Deacon Tim Grimes and Deacon John Vu – and two scheduled for ordination next year – Mr. Mathew Dunn and Mr. Danny Roussel. Meanwhile one priest has announced his retirement from active ministry this summer – Father Mike Schatzle, pastor of St. George Parish.

Priests in our diocese are eligible to retire at the age of 68. Most work past that age and we currently have 7 priests over the age of 68 who are still serving as pastors. (The oldest are Father Mike Moroney, pastor of St. Alphonsus Church in Greenwell Springs, and Father Frank Uter, pastor of Immaculate Conception Parish in Denham Springs, who are both 74 years old.) We also have 19 priests who are retired, of which 10 are still healthy enough to assist with Masses around the Diocese.

Lent is just over one week away so please take note of our Mass and confession schedule for Lent. Our Masses on **Ash Wednesday**, March 6, 2019, will be at 8:00 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 6:00 p.m. Daily Mass remains at the normal time of 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, but moves to 6:00 p.m. on the Wednesdays of Lent. Benediction and Adoration remains at 8:30 a.m. on Friday mornings or immediately following the Friday morning Mass.


On the **Wednesdays of Lent**, confessions are at 5:30 p.m., followed by Mass at 6:00 p.m. and then the Way of the Cross at 6:30 p.m. I will also be in the confessional from 6:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. each Wednesday as

part of the "Light is On for You" program. I encourage everyone to try to attend at least one daily Mass each week as part of your Lenten devotions.

Our monthly 12 hour period of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament begins at 8:00 p.m. this Friday, March 1, and ends with 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday, March 2. All are invited to sign-up for an hour of prayer and adoration during the night or early morning. You are free to sit or kneel in silent prayer, or pray the rosary, or engage in spiritual reading and meditation while in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

Football may be over but the LSU basketball team is exceeding all expectations and the LSU baseball team has begun their season which will hopefully end in Omaha.

Church Roof

The original design of our church roof incorporated embossed rectangular metal shingles, a somewhat popular option of the time, for their ease of manufacture, attractiveness and longevity. They were made of galvanized iron and were designed to be nailed down and interlocked with adjacent shingles. The embossed pattern added decoration, strength and the ability to conceal minor dents from windblown debris.

It is unknown when the metal shingles were replaced, but it was likely after the 1934 decision not to rebuild the original steeple following its second destruction by a hurricane. Salvaged shingles were recycled for use on other buildings in Brusly.

The roof which replaced the metal shingles was made of diamond shaped transite tiles. Most parishioners will recall this as the roof on the church prior to its 2011 renovation. Transite is an asbestos impregnated cement product. It is long lasting but has a tendency to become brittle with age making it prone to cracking and difficult to repair. The tiles were originally white, but had weathered to black over decades of exposure.

For the 2011 renovation, the Building Committee wished to install new roofing that recalled the design of the former roof. The architect found a synthetic slate product made with new and recycled rubber. The tiles were cast from molds of real diamond shaped slate tiles and colored in multiple tones of gray to add visual interest to the roof

When the transite roof was removed, some of the original metal shingles were discovered—their having been used as flashing and patches for holes in sheathing. One of these metal shingles was saved for display in our archives. --Submitted by Brian Falcon
