Dear Parishioners,

I have been reappointed to the role of Diocesan Director of Seminarians effective February 16, 2018 through August 31, 2018. This is a part-time role that should not have any adverse effect on my assignment as your pastor. This appointment will allow Father Matt Dupré to better focus on his health and his primary responsibility as pastor of St. Patrick Parish in Baton Rouge. I have not received any word on when Father Dupré will return from his current leave of absence so please continue to pray for him.

As Director of Seminarians I will work closely with Father Andrew Merrick who serves as our Diocesan Director of Vocations and pastor of Christ the King Parish. Father Merrick's primary role is to promote vocations to the priesthood while my responsibility will focus on overseeing the seminary formation of our candidates. Both of us will collaborate on the appropriate screening of candidates during the discernment and application process.

Work should begin soon to repair some termite damage which was discovered in the church. Termites had apparently entered through the tiny gap between the brick plaza and the front of the church, and then damaged the hardwood flooring and wood framing on the windows high above the front doors. Thankfully, our contract with Orkin will cover the cost of the repairs.

You may also have noticed that we recently installed a Celtic cross on the concrete arch at the entrance of our mausoleum. This cross had originally been fabricated to go on the exterior of the church but was discovered to be too small. So we decided to repurpose it for the mausoleum. I thank Jerry Deshotel for overseeing its modification and installation.

This year's Lenten Mission begins next Sunday and will be led by Mrs. Becky Eldredge. You will have an opportunity to meet Becky at the Sunday morning Masses, and then the actual presentations will be held on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday, March 4, 5, and 6, beginning at 7:00 p.m. each night. Becky is an Ignatian -trained spiritual director, retreat facilitator, and writer. She is married with three children and lives in her hometown of Baton Rouge.

The theme for this year's Mission is "Hope for the Restless Heart." Sunday night's gathering will help us to recognize God's voice as he speaks to us through our restlessness. Monday night's session will focus on prayer as a response to God's initiative. Lastly, Tuesday night's presentation will focus on the virtue of hope in the life of a disciple. I encourage you to attend.

Our monthly 12 hour period of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament begins at 8:00 p.m. this Friday, March 2, and ends with 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday, March 3. All are invited to sign-up for an hour of prayer and adoration during the night or early morning. You are free to sit or kneel in silent prayer, or pray the rosary, or engage in spiritual reading and meditation while in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

#### **Second Sunday of Lent**

How are your Lenten resolutions? By the time week two rolls around, plenty of well-meaning people have skipped, neglected, or outright forgotten their Lenten resolutions at least once. It can be easy to start excusing our Lenten commitments altogether.

Last week we saw Jesus driven into the desert. This Sunday, we see Jesus leading his disciples to an equally barren place: he "led them up a high mountain apart by themselves." But what happens there? "And he was transfigured before them and his clothes became dazzling white." Today's Gospel reminds us of the goal. We don't enter into the desert for the sake of suffering, but for the sake of transformation.

Mountain imagery is prevalent throughout Scripture. The sacrifice of Isaac, Moses receiving the 10 Commandments, Elijah's revelation of God as a tiny whispering sound: all these occur on the mountaintop. Mountains are strenuous to hike. To assist the traveler in the assent, trails often involve switchbacks. These lead the traveler back and forth across the mountainside, sometimes appearing as if hardly any ground is gained. Perhaps Peter, James, and John hiked a similar path as Jesus led them up the side of Mount Tabor.

A climb is difficult. A climb in a barren place leaves you thirsty, exhausted, and quite possibly frustrated or discouraged. Yet this is precisely how Jesus leads his closest disciples. Why? Because he has something to reveal to them. Practically speaking, Jesus needed to bring Peter, James and John away from the crowds for this revelation of glory to remain hidden. There are spiritual truths we will encounter only if we pass through difficulty. So let's persevere this Lent! Today's Gospel invites us to trust that, if we persevere in following Jesus, he'll lead us to something beautiful and glorious as well.
