Dear Parishioners,

Here is a summary of our parish finances for the first six months of the fiscal year, July – December 2019. Our income from the Sunday collections and other earnings totaled \$407,197. Our building fund collections for the same period totaled \$69,069.

Our expenses for the six-month period totaled \$408,984 which just slightly exceeded our income. The added expenditures included repairs to sound system in church, the fire panel in the activity center, and heating and air-conditioning units throughout the campus.

About 110 families now use the Automatic Bank Draft option for their stewardship offering to the Church so please know that this is available if you would like to set it up. It typically means switching to a monthly schedule of giving rather than weekly, but you can choose the first or fifteenth of each month for your contribution, and use it for the regular offertory as well as the building fund. I made the switch myself and find it very convenient. However, I still use the mailed envelopes for the special collections. Please talk to Carolyn Dupuy in the office for more information or for assistance in setting up this method of giving.

We opened the bids for the porte-cochere and storage addition to our parish activity center last week and the low bid was \$230,000 submitted by Faulk and Meek, the same contractor who did such a good job on our church restoration. Their bid was very close to the architect's estimated cost for the project.

Thanks to your generous support of the monthly building fund collection, as well as several generous contributions from our Zippers Thrift Shop, we have more than adequate funds in our savings to pay cash for this project. I hope to start construction soon but that may depend on the water level of the Mississippi River. Safeguards placed on the levee system do not allow us to undertake any construction projects if the river is too high.

On Thursday, February 13, at 6:30 p.m., I am meeting with our 2nd graders and their parents in the church to walk through the Mass. We will look at the vestments, furnishings, and all of the sacred vessels we use to celebrate the Mass, and then talk about their significance as part of their preparation for First Communion on April 19, 2020.

Please pray for Deacon Danny Roussel who spent the summer of 2017 with us as part of his pastoral training. Danny has been dealing with issues of anxiety and depression and so is taking a temporary health leave in order to receive professional help. His ordination to the priesthood will be delayed by a year but he will be a much happier and stronger priest in the long run.

Congratulations once again to Father Joel LaBauve who celebrated his 50th anniversary with us last Saturday. May God continue to bless him for his service.


