Dear Parishioners,

I am on vacation in Gatlinburg, Tennessee this week, and so I thank Father John Carville and Father Joel LaBauve for celebrating our Masses this weekend. We will have Communion Services in place of the 8:00 a.m. Masses this Tuesday – Friday, January 19-22, while I am away. I return this Friday evening in time for next weekend's Masses.

President-elect Joe Biden will be sworn in as the 46th president of the United States this Wednesday, January 20, 2021. The oath of office for president is quite brief, much shorter than the oath taken by the vice president or a member of the house or senate: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will faithfully execute the Office of President of the United States, and will to the best of my ability, preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the United States."

Biden becomes only the second Catholic to hold the office of president, the first being John F. Kennedy who served from 1961 until his assassination on November 22, 1963. On a related note, Catholics now make up the largest single religious group in Congress, having 24 senate and 134 house seats, equal to 29% of the 117th Congress.

Despite having a stutter, president-elect Biden has a politician's ability to connect with ordinary people. However, he is very weak in defending the sanctity of the unborn. He has said that he accepts the Church's teaching that life begins at conception, but yet supports a woman's right to decide whether to end a pregnancy.


When the Republicans are in the majority, many pro-life efforts focus on legislative and judicial means to end abortion. When the Democrats are in the majority, perhaps we can work to reduce the number of abortions by focusing on the causes. This might provide an area of common ground between the incoming administration and our Catholic faith community. In either case, our best hope for promoting the sanctity of life is to evangelize society at large so that hearts continue to be transformed.

Prayer is essential in all things and Friday, January 22, is designated as a "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." Also, the Louisiana Life March is being replaced this year by "Stand for Life Louisiana!" This event will take place on Saturday, January 23, via social media and at various locations around the state, including outside of the Delta Clinic on Colonial Drive in Baton Rouge. 




