Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, January 3, is the tenth day of Christmas and the day on which we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany this year. Many countries engage in gift giving on the Epiphany rather than on Christmas in remembrance of the gifts presented to Jesus by the Magi. Our liturgical celebration of the Christmas season extends for one more week and concludes with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Sunday, January 10, 2021.

I mentioned in last week's bulletin that Pope Francis has declared 2021 to be a year dedicated to St. Joseph. This has particular significance to us for a couple of reasons. First, our cathedral and therefore our entire diocese is under the patronage of St. Joseph. Second, our parish was officially founded on March 19, the Solemnity of St. Joseph, in 1835. So we have a special connection to this beloved saint as the universal Church celebrates his deep faith and implores his protection and care during this coming year.

I also noted that the Vatican has recognized five 19th century Louisiana priests as *Servants of God*, the first step towards canonization. Fathers Jean Pierre, Isidore Quémerais, Jean-Marie Biler, Louis Gergaud, and François Le Vézouët, were all natives of Brittany, France, and were recruited to come to Louisiana by Bishop Auguste Marie Martin, the founding bishop of the Diocese of Natchitoches, which later became the Dioceses of Alexandria and Shreveport.

All five of the priests died while caring for the sick during the 1873 yellow fever epidemic. The first died on September 15, and the fifth died just three weeks later on October 8, 1873. The youngest was 26 and the oldest was 41 years of age at the time of their deaths. You can read more about their heroic witness by visiting the website https://shreveportmartyrs.org/.

Louisiana experienced its first outbreak of yellow fever in 1796, and its last in 1905. Outbreaks occurred just about every summer during that period with the worst epidemic years appearing in the 1850's. The greatest number of deaths occurred in 1853 when more than 8,000 people died. Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos died 14 years later on October 4, 1867, six years prior to the deaths of the five north Louisiana priests.

I am writing this letter a couple of days before Christmas, and the current number of deaths attributed to COVID-19 in Louisiana stands at around 7,000. A vaccine has recently been approved but it will take several months before it is produced and distributed in sufficient quantities for everyone to receive it. Our U.S. Bishops have encouraged us to do so, and the Vatican has also issued a statement reassuring Catholics that it is morally acceptable to receive the vaccine, especially given the very serious danger posed by this virus.

We are celebrating another Mass for our Christian Formation students in grades K and 8 this Tuesday, January 5, at approximately 5:45 p.m. Parents are of course welcome to attend the Mass together with the students and teachers.
