Dear Parishioners,

The grace-filled season of Lent begins this Wednesday, March 6, so give some thought on how you wish to deepen your faith during this special time. Our Masses on **Ash Wednesday** will be at 8:00 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 6:00 p.m. Daily Mass remains at the normal time of 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, but moves to 6:00 p.m. on the Wednesdays of Lent. Benediction and Adoration remains at 8:30 a.m. on Friday mornings or immediately following the Friday morning Mass.

On the **Wednesdays of Lent**, confessions are at 5:30 p.m., followed by Mass at 6:00 p.m. and then the Way of the Cross at 6:30 p.m. I will also be in the confessional from 6:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. each Wednesday as part of the "Light is On for You" program. I encourage everyone to try to attend at least one daily Mass each week, and also to go to confession sometime during the Lenten season.

Priests are fortunate in that we have ample opportunities to celebrate Mass as part of our vocation and ministry. But we still benefit by taking on extra sacrifices for Lent and removing certain forms of temptation from our lives. I know plenty of priests who give up alcohol for Lent, and even one priest who gives up coffee. I usually give up television which has the added benefit of encouraging me to go to bed a little earlier than usual. Other friends give up social media or limit their time on the computer. Our goal is to make these 40 days different from the rest of the year so that we can become more thoughtful and considerate.

We are excited to offer a three-night Lenten Mission this year led by Father Whitney Miller, a priest of the Diocese of Lake Charles. The Mission will be held Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, April 1, 2, and 3, beginning at 7:00 p.m. each night. Father Miller will introduce the Mission by preaching at all of the weekend Masses on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. We look forward to his visit to our parish and the opportunity to strengthen our faith and deepen our love for God.

The theme for this year's Mission is "Living the Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love." Monday night's gathering will center on "Right Faith;" Tuesday night's session will focus on "Sure Hope;" Wednesday night's theme is "Perfect Charity." Father Miller will likely celebrate an 8:00 a.m. morning Mass on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday mornings for the benefit of those who cannot attend the evening presentations.

Our parish office will be closed on Monday and Tuesday of this week for Mardi Gras, and our morning Mass is also canceled on Tuesday, Mardi Gras Day. Have a safe and happy holiday and see you on Wednesday. Remember that Ash Wednesday, like Good Friday, is a day of both fast and abstinence, meaning that we limit ourselves to one full meal (and two light snacks), and abstain from eating meat. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Daylight Saving Time starts next Sunday, March 10, so remember to move your clocks ahead by one hour before going to bed next Saturday night. Otherwise you may be late for Mass.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

•••In the Diocese of Baton Rouge, as in the rest of the Church in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound by a **grave obligation** to observe a **solemn fast** on *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday*. Catholics between the ages of 14 and up are to **abstain from meat** on *Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday* as well. These norms have been established by the United States' *National Conference of Catholic Bishops* in accord with the norms of canons 1249-1253 in the revised **Code of Cannon Law** of 1983.

• • • To fast means to consume only one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink "between meals" (excepting only water and medicine) is not permitted on fast days.

____To **abstain** from meat means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork, or poultry at least, although not necessarily eggs, milk products, or condiments made from animal fat. The consumption of fish, shellfish, and reptiles is permitted if desired.

useIn addition to the mandatory days listed above, abstinence from meat on every Friday throughout the year which is not a solemnity, and fasting on all Lenten weekdays (especially Wednesdays and Fridays) and on Holy Saturday, is strongly **recommended** to all the faithful. There always remains, of course, the grave obligation to participate at Holy Mass on all Sundays and days of obligation.

•••Each in his or her own way, every Christian is bound to do penance by virtue of divine law. Only ill health or some similar situation of urgency excuses. During the Lenten Season, Christ Jesus' own challenges to "prayer, fasting and almsgiving' are paramount (see the Gospel reading for Ash Wednesday, Mt. 6:1-6,16-18). We seek ongoing forgiveness for sin (especially in the Sacrament of Penance) and come to appreciate ever more the great sufferings and sacrifice which Our Savior experienced for the sake of our salvation.

•••Clergy (priests and deacons)and those religious priests who have legitimate residence and active ministry within the Diocese of Baton Rouge have been delegated the power to dispense the faithful of the diocese, in individual cases and for a just reason, from the obligation to observe a particular day of penance, or to commute some or all of its obligations to other pious works. Included in this is the faculty to dispense from the Lenten obligations to fast and abstain from meat. Yet the obligation to do some kind of penance remains a serious one, and will not be taken lightly by a good Catholic.
