Dear Parishioners,

Bishop Duca recently issued a decree allowing weddings to take place on Saturday evenings in the Diocese of Baton Rouge. However, the decision to schedule Saturday evening weddings is left to the discretion of each pastor.

I have decided to leave our current policy for weddings unchanged for the immediate future, or in other words, to *not* allow weddings at St. John the Baptist on Saturday evenings. The weekend Mass schedule is already taxing enough on me and our musicians, plus I am concerned about the wear and tear on our church by scheduling that many services so close together.

Some might ask what is the difference between a wedding on Saturday afternoon versus one on Saturday evening. The difference is that we have more time to prepare the church for a Saturday afternoon wedding as compared with Saturday evening given the Vigil Mass. Therefore, we will continue to recommend Fridays for those who wish an evening service, and Saturday mornings or afternoons for those who prefer a weekend service.


I mentioned in last week's bulletin that we received a generous \$10,000 donation from the Zippers Thrift Shop. I intend to use this money to refurbish our classrooms in preparation for the return of our Christian Formation students this fall. Several of the rooms are in need of a fresh coat of paint along with new air-conditioners and whiteboards, and this generous donation will allow us to provide a more welcoming environment for our children to grow in their faith.

Also, as mentioned last week, we need to scale back the operation of our Thrift Shop ministry somewhat. Effective immediately, please limit your donations to clothing, toys, and kitchen items, and reroute your larger items such as furniture, mattresses, or televisions to one of the charitable organizations in Baton Rouge. Thank you for your understanding.

Our Lenten Mission is this Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, March 22, 23, and 24, beginning at 7:00 p.m. each night. Our retreat director is Father Jim Sichko, a native of Orange, Texas and a priest of the Diocese of Lexington, Kentucky. All Christian Formation classes are cancelled this week in favor of the Mission, so I hope you will be able to join us for one or more nights of the Mission.

I will be out on Thursday evening through Friday morning this week, so we will have a Communion Service in place of Mass on Friday. For those who participated in Operation Rice Bowl during Lent, you may start returning your monies to church next weekend. Lastly, Catholic Life Television just completed a new video featuring Stations of the Cross from around our Diocese, including the 3rd Station from our own church.
