Dear Parishioners,

We are nearing the one-year anniversary of the temporary suspension of all public Masses in our Diocese in an effort to limit the spread of COVID 19. Bishop Duca announced on March 16, 2020 that all public celebrations of Sunday and daily Masses were to be suspended effective March 17, 2020. So, the Third Sunday of Lent in 2020 was the last time we were able to gather for Mass until the lifting of the suspension on May 16, 2020.

Priests still celebrated Mass daily, but in empty churches without the benefit of a congregation. Parishes closed their offices for several weeks, and Catholics as well as all citizens of the state were encouraged to stay at home as much as possible. Lenten Missions, Stations of the Cross, and fish dinners were all canceled, and Catholics lost the opportunity to gather for the beautiful Holy Week and Easter Services.

Living through this pandemic has given us a greater appreciation for the Eucharist and the ability to practice our faith in all of its wonderful expressions. Pope Francis' visit to Iraq this weekend reminds us that sickness is not the only threat to religious practice but also terrorism and discrimination against people for their religious beliefs. Christians living under totalitarian or communist rule are quite limited in their ability to worship and practice their faith. Many face insults and even threats of violence on a daily basis.

We pray for Pope Francis and the people of Iraq as he makes the first ever visit of a pope to their country. It will take an international effort to restore peace to a region that has been devastated by sectarian violence and war, but perhaps the Pope's visit can contribute to that effort. In addition to visiting the Christian communities, the Holy Father is scheduled to meet with Grand Ayatollah Ali al-Sistani, the 90-year-old spiritual leader of the country's Shiite Muslims.

Here at home, we pray for the successful completion of our own Lenten journey of faith. We pray for the grace to confront those feelings of prejudice and hatred which reside in our own hearts so that we can achieve greater peace of mind and greater solidarity with all of God's children. Our struggles unite us with Christ in his passion so that we might welcome new life at Easter.

This year's Lenten Mission is two weeks away and will be led by Father Jim Sichko, a native of Orange, Texas and a priest of the Diocese of Lexington, Kentucky. The Mission will be held Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, March 22, 23, and 24, beginning at 7:00 p.m. each night. Father Sichko will introduce the Mission by preaching at all of the weekend Masses on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Please mark your calendars and make plans to attend.


Daylight Saving Time starts next Sunday, March 14, so remember to move your clocks ahead by one hour before going to bed next Saturday night.


