Dear Parishioners,

Blessed Charles de Foucauld and Blessed Titus Brandsma are among the holy men and women scheduled to be canonized saints by Pope Francis this Sunday, May 15, in St. Peter's Square in Rome. I wrote about Blessed Charles de Foucauld last week and this week I offer a few words on Blessed Titus Brandsma.

Titus Brandsma (1881-1942) was raised on a small dairy farm in the Netherlands, the country of Vincent Van Gogh, Rembrandt, and Anne Frank, bordering Belgium and Germany. He joined the Carmelites and was ordained a priest in 1905. He had a strong interest in both Carmelite spirituality and journalism, and traveled to the U.S. in 1935 to give a series of lectures at Carmelite foundations.

Blessed Titus was serving as spiritual advisor to the Catholic journalists of the Netherlands when the Nazis invaded in May 1940. He encouraged opposition to the publication of Nazi propaganda in Catholic newspapers, and was arrested by the Gestapo while personally delivering letters from the bishops to the editors of the Catholic newspapers. He was 60 years old at the time of his arrest.

Titus was held at a couple of labor camps in Holland before being transferred to the Dachau concentration camp in southern Germany. Although he suffered from malnutrition, forced labor, and cruel beatings, he remained a source of support and hope for the other prisoners. The nurse who administered the lethal injection which killed him, later testified that she always remembered the face of the priest who had compassion on her.

This Thursday is the last day of school in West Baton Rouge Parish so I congratulate all of our students and teachers on the completion of another successful year. I pray that everyone will have a restful and enjoyable summer vacation.

Father Babu Nalkara, IMS is scheduled to visit our parish next weekend, May 21-22, to make an appeal on behalf of the *Delhi Province of the Indian Missionary Society*. Father Babu is one of several priests from the Indian Missionary Society currently serving in our Diocese, and is stationed at St. Ann Parish in Morganza. The Indian Missionary Society, founded in 1903, is the first indigenous missionary organization in India. Our support is critical to their ongoing ministry and service to the Catholic minority in India.

Father Babu's visit is coordinated by our Diocesan Propagation of the Faith Office and provides an opportunity for us to support the pastoral ministry and missionary activity of the Church. We will have a second collection at each of our Masses next weekend to benefit the *Indian Missionary Society* and all of their priests and parishioners. As always, please make your checks out to St. John the Baptist Church so we can count and deposit the collection, and then forward the proceeds to our Propagation of the Faith Office, who will then forward the money to the *Indian Missionary Society*.




