Dear Parishioners,

The Gospel passage this weekend speaks about two categories of people: the risk takers and those that are cautious. The first category is represented by the ones who were given five talents and two talents, respectively. The Greek word for talent is *talentos*, which refers to quantity. As Jesus uses it in the parable, a talent is not something that we possess, but what God possesses and loans to his servants. Therefore, the talents belonged to the Lord who entrusted them to his servants for use in trade. According to the parable, the first category of people is the two men who traded with their amounts and made ten and four talents respectively. And as we can see, their business risk paid off. The person who received one talent represented the second category, the cautious one. He seemed to be afraid of the master, whom he understood as harsh and unjust and who would make unreasonable demands on him. This fear made him not use the amount in trading, but instead he hid the talent in the ground. We see this man as someone who was unwilling to take any risks. And as expected, when the master returned from his trip abroad, he praised and rewarded the ones who took the risk and traded with their talents. As for the overcautious man, the master was stern and harsh with him for hiding the talent in the ground, and he was given rigorous punishment. The Christin life, may in a way, be seen as a time of waiting for the Master. We are given this life as a gift by the Master. The question is, how do we use the life given to us? Do we take risks in our lives by making this life productive? Or do we act like the one who was cautious and did not use his talents.

I can be like the cautious one when I am guarded by becoming stiff and rigid, which can prevent me from experiencing emotions of love, joy, sadness, grief, etc. Therefore, I will raise barriers which keep me from experiencing and learning about myself and my self worth or value. It is only when I am in touch with myself, that I become aware of myself at a deeper level. Another area where I am cautious is in establishing relationships. I am afraid that if I form a relationship, or share with others in depth, that I could be rejected; or that demands may be made of me, or that I may not be able to cope with my own issues in any relationship. Therefore, I keep to myself and mingle with only those who I am comfortable with. But taking a risk in a relationship will open up new avenues for learning about oneself, developing a friendship or engaging in common projects with others.

Another area where I may not want to take a risk is in the area of using some of my own talents, that I haven't utilized thus far. One of the common excuses people give for not utilizing their own talents is, "I have never done this before." These people just stay with what they have tried and will not venture into new tasks, or utilize new talents, or assume new responsibilities, or take up leadership in organizations or communities. We have seen people who were willing to venture into the unknown, enrich themselves and make their lives successful. In the Gospel Parable, we see that the ones who took risks pleased the master, and they were greatly rewarded. Similarly, when we are willing to take a risk, we allow ourselves to experience emotions, deepen our relationships and utilize new talents for our community, and for our Church Parish. Hence, we will discover that our lives have been enriched in the process, and we will be rewarded greatly. This weekend the Church is inviting us to take risks in experiencing emotions, deepening our relationships with others, and utilizing our talents and gifts for our Church Parish and our community. Let us pray for God's grace in taking risks in our lives, so that we can enrich ourselves, our Church Parish, and our Community.


