Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the last Sunday of our liturgical year—the solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is a fairly new feast added to the Church calendar in 1925 on the Sunday before All Saints by Pope Pius XI, and moved to its present location on the last Sunday of the Church year in 1969. Christ the King is also the name of the parish and student center on the L.S.U. campus which serves all of the Catholic students and faculty.

Christ's kingship is a spiritual and eternal kingship, and as such is not concerned with earthly power and privilege. However, this does not mean that the Church should appear detached and uninterested in human affairs. In service to Christ our King, the Church bears witness to the truth by proclaiming and protecting the dignity of every man, woman, and child. This means that we work within whatever political system we find ourselves to serve the highest good.

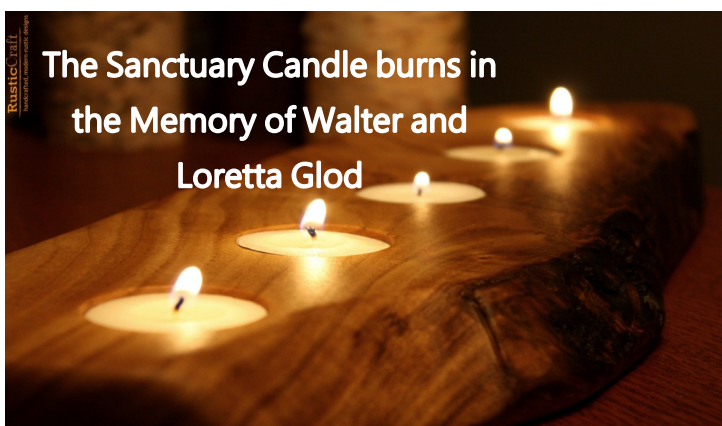
The Catholic Church does not and cannot align itself with any particular political party or candidate. The Church's role is to educate her members regarding the teachings of our faith, to help provide analysis of important issues, and to participate in the debate over public policy. To do less would turn religion into a purely private matter without any practical effect on our communal life and the well-being of our society.

Nearly all of the numbers have now been tabulated for this year's *Feast on the Levee* and our net income looks to be around \$50,000. Thank you very much for all that you did to contribute to our success through the sale of raffle tickets, the donation of auction items, and the preparation of food. Thanks once again to Natalie Palermo and all who worked so hard to benefit our Church and community.

The great majority of the income will be deposited into our building fund savings account. I would like to earmark a small amount to refurbish or improve the kitchen equipment in our Parish Activity Center. I also wish to donate about \$5,000 to St. Mary's Catholic Church in Fannett, Texas where a classmate of mine, Father Jim McClintock, is pastor. Two years ago, St. Mary's was seriously damaged by flooding from Hurricane Harvey. Then, in September of this year, the church was again flooded by Tropical Storm Imelda. So they need our prayers and encouragement as they rebuild for the second time in two years.

Everyone is invited to attend Thanksgiving Day Mass with us at 8:00 a.m. Thursday morning. As in the past, you are also invited to bring a canned good with you to our Thanksgiving Day Mass to benefit our food pantry. We will **not** have Mass or Adoration on Friday, the day after Thanksgiving. I plan to visit my family on Thanksgiving Day and then watch the New Orleans Saints take on the Atlanta Falcons on Thanksgiving evening. Christian Formation Classes are canceled on November 25, 26, and 27 due to the Thanksgiving holidays.

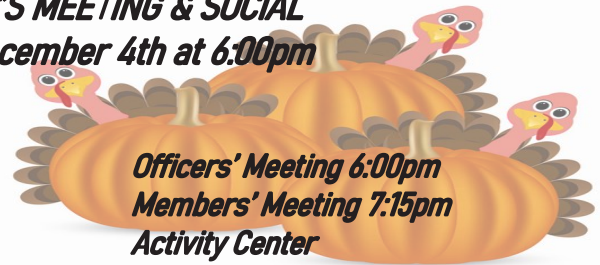

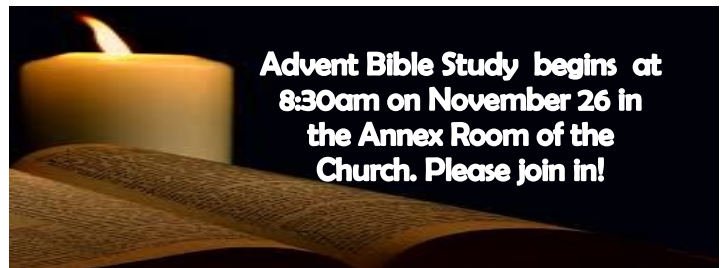

St. Michael the Archangel

We invoke St. Michael the Archangel for protection from evil and temptation. He is the protector of the Church. He is the leader of God's heavenly host and archangels. He attends souls at the hour of death and executes God's judgment regarding our eternal destiny.

In our church, St. Michael was represented in dramatic physical form as an approximately four feet tall statue probably cast of plaster and painted in lifelike colors. Period photos show the statue located on a pedestal behind the ambo.

St. Michael was depicted clad in armor, standing victoriously atop Satan. In an outstretched right hand he grasped a sword. In his left hand he held scales, a reference to his weighing souls. Extant photos are unclear on the treatment of his head wear. In differing images he appears to be attired in a helmet or a crown. A helmet would be appropriate in Michael's role as soldier. A crown would be appropriate based on his princely rank among the angels.

At the statue's base was Satan. He appears to have been sculpted in the form of a dragon with webbed wings and a tail writhing under the crushing blows of the Archangel.

There is no known record of the statue's origin or when it was purchased for the church. It is presumed to have been removed with some of our other statuary and auctioned. Its whereabouts or if it still exists have never been confirmed.

St. Michael's presence in our church has been returned in a different form. An image of him has been hung at the devotional in our gathering space. His feast day is celebrated on September 29th.
