Dear Parishioners,

The parable of the royal banquet is a parable about the Kingdom of God and about the people who will eventually belong to it. The actual parable is the story of a king who celebrated the wedding feast of his son. When the invited guests refused to come, he brought people from the streets to take their places. The parable also shows that among those who attended the wedding, some of them did not come with the wedding garments, and thus insulted the king. The parable therefore shows us three possible kinds of guests. There are the absentee guests who initially accepted the invitation, but when the time came to honor the invitation, they withdrew. There are the guests without wedding garments who attend the feast, but do not take the trouble to dress themselves according to the occasion. And lastly, we have the guests with wedding garments, who make the necessary preparations, to present themselves fit for the banquet of the king.


We can say that the absentee guests are not bad people, but that they chose to do their own thing. One went to his farm, another to his business, and others had legitimate reasons for not honoring the king's invitation. Sometimes what keeps us away from the joy of the kingdom is not sin, but preoccupation with the necessities of life. To be serious with your job is a good thing, but when your job keeps you away from attending the Lord's Supper and Mass; then it becomes an obstacle that hinders you from experiencing the joy of the Lord in your life. There is a saying that, the good is the enemy of the best. If only those absentee guests knew what they were missing by not attending the feast! It used to be that people attended church service to fulfill a "Sunday obligation", otherwise it would be counted against them as sin. This kind of fear no longer motivates young people today. More people would probably come to church if they knew they were missing out on the fun of celebrating and feasting with the Christian community.

For the guest without the wedding garment, to speculate on whether he had enough time to go home and put on his wedding garment, is beside the point of the parable. The point of the parable is: if you must go to the dance, you must wear your dancing shoes. If you go to a wedding, you should wear your wedding garment. By not wearing a wedding garment, he was physically in the party, but his mind and spirit were not there. He was at the feast, but he was not in the mood for feasting. Jesus hates this kind of hypocritical attitude. In fact, it is better not to attend at all, rather than to be there and yet not be there. The invitation is to all, the party is free for all, yet anyone who decides to attend has a responsibility to present himself or herself fit for the king's company. The kingdom of God is freely offered to us. Those of us on the way to the kingdom must spare no effort in acquiring the moral and spiritual character that is consonant with life in the kingdom.

Finally, there are the guests who attended the wedding feast, taking care to appear in the proper wedding garment. They are the only ones who have fun and enjoy the party. They are the models whose example we should follow. Today's gospel sends a message to those who are staying away from the Lord's Supper and are missing out on the joy of life. To those of us who have accepted the invitation to come in, this parable warns us not to take God's grace for granted, but to clean ourselves up and become the most beautiful person that we can be in God's sight. The message is the same as in Colossians 3:14: "Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony."

The Sanctuary Candle burns in memory of Viola H. Prejean.




