Dear Parishioners,

The German Catholic philosopher Dietrich von Hildebrand (1889-1977) was an outspoken critic of Adolph Hitler and Nazism. His commitment to the truth and to a Catholic worldview forced him to flee to Austria in 1933, and then to the United States in 1940, just ahead of the German army. He taught philosophy at Fordham University until his retirement in 1960. His writings on marriage and Christian philosophy were especially influential.

David Mills, a Catholic columnist and former editor of First Things, wrote an article last year summarizing some of von Hildebrand's insights on patriotism, which are especially timely given today's political climate. One of his most important insights was to distinguish between patriotism and nationalism.

Patriotism is a "well-ordered love" for one's country. It includes a sense of belonging and also a sense of gratitude for everything one receives from one's country. Nationalism on the other hand, ultimately commits "idolatry toward a nation" by placing the nation above "larger communities of people or mankind as a whole."

Von Hildebrand writes, "Nationalists never see the true values of their nation. All they see is its power, its glory, its political influence." We can readily see why Hitler was so outraged by his writing and ordered that he be arrested and executed.

Lastly, von Hildebrand wrote that real patriotism does not separate people by race or religion. "Every man, whatever his race, is created by God and after His image. Every man has an immortal soul destined for eternal communion with God. Race, according to Catholic doctrine, is a quite secondary and accidental biological factor, having no effect upon the possibility of man's attaining his eternal end...Men as such are all equal before God: all are fallen in Adam, all are redeemed in Christ."

The 10th Annual *Ava and Jacob Saucier Memorial Scholarship Benefit Jambalaya* will take place next Sunday, September 8, from 10:30 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. at Holy Family Parish Hall in Port Allen. The dinners are \$8 each and the proceeds are used to provide tuition scholarships to Holy Family School.

This Friday evening and Saturday morning, September 6 & 7, is the monthly all-night Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament led by our Catholic Daughters. The twelve-hour period begins at 8:00 p.m. Friday evening and ends with 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday morning. A schedule is available in the back of church if you would like to sign-up for an hour of prayer and adoration in the presence of our Lord.

The parish office will be closed on Monday, September 2, in recognition of Labor Day and to allow our hardworking staff a day of rest. As much as we enjoy days off and vacation, studies show that most Americans also derive a great deal of pleasure from their work. 
