Emergency calls answered as soon as possible. Communion calls to homebound weekly by request. Please notify the office if someone is homebound.


CHRISTIAN BURIAL

Dear Parishioners,

"Pigeon Feathers" is a story about a boy who begins to have doubts about Jesus. One night in bed, the boy decides upon an experiment. He lifts his hand above his head and asks Jesus to touch it. Then he waits. After a while he puts his hand down again, not sure if Jesus touched it or not. Do we all not crave assurances of our faith? Is it reasonable to believe what we do not see? Thomas would say, "No." He found it hard to believe what he could not see. "Unless I see the Lord," he said, "I refuse to believe." Thomas did not want to be a blind believer. He wanted evidence; and nobody could convince him of it, but Jesus himself. Jesus provided a chance for Thomas to see him and to touch him. He then became a true believer and surrendered himself, "My Lord and My God".

We all have our doubts, questions and demands for proof. Everyone's faith at times is crossed by a shadow of doubt; often we try to cover it up, hide it or suppress it. The little flame of faith in us is often weak and dim. Faith is saying to Jesus, "I trust you," and like Thomas, surrender yourself to God, "My Lord and my God." Today the Church is inviting us to reflect on our faith in Christ. One sure way to rouse up our faith is to put our faith into works. We all know that if we do not use our muscles they begin to weaken. Something similar happens to our faith if we do not exercise it. Just as we cannot separate heat from fire, we cannot have faith without works. A beautiful example of putting faith into works is the lifestyle of the early Christian community. As we heard in the first reading, they practiced in their lives the simplicity and renunciation in imitation of the master. They put into action the teachings of their master.

Is our faith founded on Jesus, the risen Christ? St. Peter in the second reading tells us that the resurrection is not just an article of faith, it is one among many others. It is the very core of Christian faith and the source of all hope. True faith demands total commitment and total determination so that we can say as Thomas did, "Let us go and die with him." It's our total commitment and determination that helps us to get through life in all its joys and sorrows, ups and downs, good times and bad, sickness and health. In man's search for meaning, psychotherapist Viktor Frankl notes that many war prisoners caved in under pressure in Nazi death camps. As a prisoner himself, he probed for reasons why some of them became victims of pressure and others did not. He discovered that those who held firm were prisoners who believed that their lives and sufferings had ultimate meaning. Dr. Frankl concluded that faith gave the prisoners a remarkable energy and power. I am sure many of us have had experiences of faith that have helped us to survive bad situations and events happening in our lives. Easter is not over and done with after the feasting and singing of alleluia. The risen Lord in fact comes to us in every moment of our lives. Each moment that comes with Christ, this experience must deepen our love, strengthen our faith and enlighten our hope. Pray today that in every Eucharist that we participate, may it help us to strengthen our faith, experience His love, and to live in hope.
