Dear Parishioners,

We know that during spring we celebrate Easter. In the spring, the grass, the plants, the trees and the whole atmosphere comes back to life. During the winter, all of these were buried in the cold and frozen earth; but when the spring arrives, sunshine, showers and breezes return and everything comes alive. Likewise, Jesus was buried under the earth and rose again to new life; no ground could hold him. This is what we celebrate at Easter: The resurrection of Jesus. It's a historical fact that the risen Christ radiated his new life in all its power and glory wherever he went and to whomever he appeared.

God, by raising Jesus from the dead, has demonstrated that the way of Jesus is indeed the way of life, and only such life will reach its fullness. So, the celebration of Easter conveys the message of hope and courage to us. Yes, the Lord is truly risen. God never abandoned him, for He has always been faithful. Through this salvific act, God opens the salvation for all of us. It's a promise that if we follow the way of Jesus, then God will raise each one of us to a glory like that of Jesus. Hence, there is no reason for a believer to be afraid, discouraged or disappointed, for God is always faithful to His promise.

The Greek philosopher, Epictetus, a slave under the Roman Emperor, was harshly punished even for his slightest fault. Not a day passed without him receiving a beating. One day the Emperor had him beaten so severely that one of his legs broke and he became lame. A friend found him limping and asked him how he had become lame. With much serenity the philosopher answered, "I am not lame, it is only my leg." A brave and virtuous man is never deterred or disappointed. Nothing could frustrate or frighten him, for he never set his heart on material things, instead he set it on things that are imperishable, which neither moth nor rust can destroy. And so, nothing could shatter his hopes.

The message of Easter is not a thing of the past. Our mission is not to simply listen to what happened long ago, but to witness it in our daily life, to witness that God can work wonders even today in those who trust in Him. For example, every time we suffer a loss, fail in some enterprise, are disabled by an illness, we die a little bit, but we believe in the presence of the risen Christ in our midst, who would enable us to discover new dreams, new challenges and new reasons to try again. Every time we are overwhelmed by problems, discouraged by disappointment, beset by worries, or humiliated by friends, we are diminished in some way. But if we believe in the real presence of the risen Jesus, we will find the impossible becomes possible and the unreachable becomes reachable. The risen Christ is relevant for us even today; it's not just a remembrance of the past. If the risen Christ is not relevant for us today, where can we find forgiveness, the wellspring of new beginning? Where would we draw the energy for following him right to the end of our existence? It's because God wanted Easter to be relevant for us today, that he has arranged a way for us to follow the risen Jesus. He comes to us every day through the Holy Eucharist. Each Eucharist that we partake is sharing in Jesus' own passion and resurrection. Christ came forth from the tomb that we might shake off the fetters of fear and evil today and forever. Pray today that we may experience the risen Christ in our life and always be guided by the spirit of the Risen Jesus. I wish you all a very happy and meaningful Easter! Yes, Christ is truly Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!


