
#### Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, Jesus commanded the disciples to go and preach the Gospel and said, "Behold I am with you always till the end of the world." This is very encouraging for us to know that Jesus is with us always, and he will continue to be with us until the end of the world. Today, when we are surrounded by problems of every kind, confronted by crises and tensions, we think of the good days when the Lord strengthened the Church with his presence and power. We might ask, "Is the Lord not with us now? Why is it that we seem to have lost the original charisma of the Church?" Hope is one of the distinguishing characteristics of every Christian. We often say: "In spite of all this, I have hope." The Church grew and was built in the midst of hopelessness and uncertainties of the disciples. Their only trust and hope were in the words of our Lord, "I will be with you till the end of the world." Hope in the power of the Lord, although invisibly present, gave them courage and strength. It was hope that gave the Church a new pulse throughout its history, to confront difficulties, turmoil and problems with courage.

Today as we celebrate the feast of the Ascension, the Church is asking us not to lose courage in the face of difficulties, but to meet the challenges of each day, to be faithful to the Church and to our lives with a renewed commitment and affirmation. If we look around, we can see thousands of people who experience meaninglessness lives and who look for love and forgiveness. When faced with difficulties and problems, we ourselves sometimes find life meaningless. The Church today presents many possibilities: the Church offers us a chance to start anew, and it helps us to look at the positive aspects of our own lives with the help of the Holy Spirit. Two brothers convicted of stealing sheep, were branded on their foreheads with the letters ST to indicate "sheep thief." One of them could not bear the stigma, became bitter, and moved away. Eventually he died and was forgotten. The other brother chose a different course. He said, "I can't run away from what I did, so I will stay here and win back the respect of my neighbors and friends." As the years passed, he built a solid reputation of integrity. One day a stranger saw him and he asked a villager, "What do the letters on that old man's forehead signify?" "It happened a long time ago," replied the villager, "I have forgotten the particulars, but I think the letters are an abbreviation for Saint."

Situations that confront us can either break us or make us, depending on the way we look at it and respond to it. If we do not find meaning in events and things that happen in our lives, whether joyful or sorrowful, then they can become situations that can break us. But if we are able to find meaning and purpose in what happens in our lives, then the situation can make us better persons. And this positive attitude can come when we are able to trust and hope in the power of the Lord, who promised to be with us until the end of the world. How do we look at the daily happenings in our lives? Are we able to put our hope in the words of the Lord? As we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, let us pray for God's grace to live as optimistic and hopeful people, always believing in the promise of the Lord, "I will be with you until the end of the world."

On a different note, I just want to let you know that I will be taking my vacation from June 6 through July 6. My mother is 88 and I want to be with her at least once a year. I will be leaving for India on June 6th and will return on July 6th. I have arranged for different priests to celebrate Mass in my absence. Besides the weekend Masses, we will have daily Mass on Mondays and Fridays. On Wednesdays and Thursdays, we will have a Communion Service. Please keep me in your valuable prayers.


