Dear Parishioners,

We all look forward to a time when there will be no war, no enemies in our midst, and everyone will be treated with love and respect. We wish that the value of any culture will be judged not by its location on the globe, but by its effect on character, and that all cultures will come together as one, and there will be peace everywhere. We look forward to that day when human beings would matter more than their culture or race. We also look forward to the day when all people and nations will be able to sing in one voice with the psalmist, "Behold how good and how pleasant for brethren to dwell together in unity." This is the dream we hope that one day will become a reality, and everyone would work toward achieving this goal.

This is what we see in the Pentecost event: The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit which gave them the courage to preach the word of God fearlessly. All barriers of nations and languages were broken down by the fusing power of the Holy Spirit, so that people who gathered there from different places heard the apostles speaking in their own language. The Holy Spirit helps the disciples to gather people from all nations to become the people of God. This is what we celebrate today, the event when Jesus filled the Church with his Spirit and sent her to establish his Kingdom on earth: the kingdom of love, peace, joy and forgiveness. We can learn many lessons from this event, such as:

- Since the Holy Spirit came when the disciples were gathered together in prayer, we can believe that the Sprit is at work when there is unity in the community and feeling of togetherness in prayer.
- The Church manifests herself as the Body of Christ to a community in prayer. Hence, we are one with Christ when we are gathered together in prayer.
- Since the Holy Spirit is alive in the communities founded in faith, we can say that when grounded and rooted in faith, our community will experience the loving presence of Christ.
- Since the unifying power is a characteristic of the Holy Spirit, it will unite the separated and it will give hope to the desperate.

It was the Pentecost event that gave the Apostles strength and courage to confess publicly their faith in Jesus. Pentecost is not just an event that took place in the past, it is only the beginning. It takes place and is taking place here and now, in a different manner perhaps, invisibly and less intensely. "How does one discover God?" asked a curious writer. The Guru responded sharply, "By making the heart white with silent meditation, and not making the paper black with religious composition." Then turning to his scholarly disciples, he teasingly added, "Or by making the air thick with learned conversation." God is Spirit, and the spirit of God comes to us every moment in truth, in prayer, in meditation and in good works. We need to believe in the power of the Holy Spirit and allow faith to blossom into works. We must first work towards transforming our local Churches to unite into loving and sharing communities. Our families, societies, and Church parishes must truly become the Body of Christ by putting our diverse talents and gifts at the service of the community. After getting our own houses in order, we must reach out to others. Therefore, as God's people, we are bound to function as divine agents in the world, to break down the walls of pride, prejudice, hatred, and war that still plague our families, societies and nations. If we are able to do this, then we can say that the power of the Holy Spirit is active and alive in us, and Pentecost is an everyday event in our lives and we are becoming agents of the Kingdom of God. Pray today that we may experience the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives, and work toward the establishment of His kingdom.




