Dear Parishioners,

The most important word we find in today's Gospel is the inconspicuous adverb "afterwards". This word signifies a change of mind. In today's parable we have two kinds of people, and though both are imperfect and unworthy, the one who finally obeyed is better than the other. The first son represents those people who profess something and do something else, and their promise is only lip-service. The second son represents people who promise little, but performs better. They may seem to be hard hearted, but ultimately generous. They may appear to be irreligious but are closer to God, than those who profess to be God-fearing. That's because they think about their actions, their lives, their answers and afterwards, change their minds.

Today's first reading and the Gospel speak of this change that each of us has to make in our lives. The prophet Ezekiel invites his people to change their lives, to turn away from sin and to turn to the Lord. In the Gospel, Jesus says that "no", need not be the final answer. There is a chance for us to change our minds, to make the "no" into a "yes". However, we must learn to say yes to others, to ourselves, to life and to God. Do we say yes to ourselves in carrying out our responsibilities in obedience to God? Perhaps we need an inner conversion so that we may go from "no" to "yes" to God. A man turned to drink and turned away from God and his family. One day while walking along, repenting for how life turned out, he saw a bent, rusty nail in the gutter. He picked it up and took it home. Placing the nail on an anvil, he began to straighten it out and clean it up. An hour later it looked almost new again. Then it occurred to him that he could straighten out and clean up his own life in the same way. That thought triggered his conversion. He turned away from drink and tuned to God and to his family. Today he keeps that nail, straightened and cleaned in his wallet. It is good to ask ourselves if we are like that bent and rusty nail. We must have hope that we can straighten and clean up our lives. All that we need to do is to say a sincere yes to God and to His ways, and God will take care of the rest.

God's call is an invitation to each one of us. If we repent and say "yes" to Him, we will say yes to eternal life. Jesus said yes to the Father, even unto his death on the cross. His yes was to do the Father's will and to serve His Father. Moreover, our happiness and salvation consist in saying yes to the Father as Jesus did, and remaining faithful to that yes. Let us today spend some time to honestly evaluate the "yes" we have uttered. Not merely the yes directed to God alone, but in our human relationships, too; such as the yes you have said to your spouse, the yes we have uttered to our children when we begot them, the yes uttered in friendships, the yes we professed when we accepted an office and its job ethics, etc. Have we become a generation that honors God and people more with our lips than with life? Mahatma Gandhi, the Indian freedom fighter, once remarked that he loved and honored Christ, but not many Christians, for many of them did not practice what Christ taught. In other words, the Christians through their baptism, say "yes" to the Lord, but like the second son in today's parable, we are only committed in words and not in deeds.

In the Gospel, neither of the sons was the kind that would bring joy to God. Both were unsatisfactory, but the one who finally obeyed is better than the other. The ideal son would be one who accepts the orders of the father willingly and fully carries them out. God wants us to be ideal sons and daughters, who always say yes to Him and to His will. But we know that as humans, it's not always easy to be ideal children of God, though we want to be. We are always given a chance to reflect on our responses and change our responses if need be, and thus change our lives for good. Let us pray today that the Good Lord may help us always say "yes" to Him and to His will in our lives, and for the grace that we be faithful to the "yes" we pronounce.


October is the month of the Rosary


